By the end of this term, the children will be familiar with the routines in the reception classroom and outdoor area. They will have been introduced to the phase 2 phonemes and will practice blending skills daily. The children will have gained confidence in a range of mathematical concepts, including counting, 2D shapes, comparing quantities and finding one more and one less. They will enjoy sharing a range of texts, learning about autumn, space, different cultures and taking part in weekly PE and music lessons.

The children will also will have experienced various parts of our Catholic faith, including Creation, Advent, collective worships and daily prayer.

Autumn Term



Literacy

Introduce the phase 2 letter sounds and tricky words. Practice blending and segmenting skills. Write own name and begin to write sounds in CVC words. Learn to form lower case letters using Little Wandle formation rhymes.

Maths

Learn numbers to 10 and number facts within 10. Become familiar with subitising, cardinality, counting forward and backwards, comparing objects and finding one more and one less. Identify 2D and 3D shapes and talk about their properties.

Personal, Social & Emotional Development

Become familiar with the rules and routines in Reception. Build positive relationships with peers and staff and share their feelings and needs. Talk about themselves and others positively. Take care of their personal belongings and personal hygiene.

Communication & Language

Begin to gain confidence to share ideas and contribute to learning during carpet times. Understand how to listen carefully and why listening is important. Listen to, talk about and recall stories and non-fiction texts using new vocabulary.

Physical Development

Sit appropriately at activities. Hold pencil effectively and begin to correctly form letters. Enjoy taking part in physical movement during PE lessons, dough disco and outdoor learning.

Expressive Arts & Design

Express themselves through paper, paint and other media. Take part in weekly music lessons and join in with nursery rhymes. Enjoy working collaboratively with their peers during pretend play.

Understanding the World

Know that everyone is special, talk about our families and respect the beliefs of others. Talk about different cultural and religious festivals. Explore the outdoor environment talking about what they see, hear and feel. Talk about pictures of familiar situations in the past.
