
Summer Term

By the end of this term, the children will begin to use their phonic knowledge to form and write simple sentences. They will have a deep understanding of numbers to 10 and easily recall number bond facts and number patterns to go alongside. They will enjoy sharing a range of texts, learning about, the life cycle of animals, the natural environments and everyday superheroes. They will continue to partake in weekly PE and music lessons.

Read and write simple sentences using phonic knowledge. Show and understanding of the stories being read through making predictions and answering questions. Continue to develop a strong love for reading.

Maths

Have a strong and deep understanding of numbers to 10 as well as verbally recalling numbers beyond 20. Be able to confidently subitise and easily recall number bonds. Learn doubling facts and recognize patterns in numbers.

Personal, Social & Emotional Development

Have a good understanding of the school virtues and values. Engage positively with both peers and staff. Manage their personal hygiene whilst being able to confidently ask for help if needed.
